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Winter Storm Alfred Response Update

Dear neighbors,

I wanted to give you another brief update on the response to Winter Storm Alfred. CL&P is reporting that East Windsor is fully restored, with the exception of one customer, and is working diligently to restore the limited number of customers still without power in Ellington. I will continue to be in contact with CL&P until all of our community is restored.

Brush removal

According to local officials, East Windsor residents are encouraged to bring their brush to the Town Garage located at 6 Woolam Road. The town will also offer their annual yard waste collection during the week of November 28th through December 2nd. At that time, town workers or contractors will pickup leaves and a "few bundles of debris." For more information on alternative methods of debris removal, as offered by the town, please visit:

For Ellington residents, Town Public Works' crews are now picking up brush and tree debris put out by residents along town roads.

Residents with sidewalks are reminded that cut brush and trees left at the curb for pick-up must not block the sidewalk. If necessary, such debris should be left just beyond the sidewalk, with butt ends towards the curb. Property owners are also asked not to place the debris near, or obstruct access to, any utility poles or wires, fire hydrants, mailboxes, sidewalks, signs or overhanging trees.

For those property owners who abut state-maintained roads (such as Rt. 140, Rt. 5, Rt. 83, etc.), state debris management contractors will continue to pick up stockpiled debris through December 15, 2011. The state Department of Transportation is currently developing a schedule for debris removal along state-maintained roads, and will make a second pass along each road if you are unable to place all of your debris at the curb during the first pass.

Public Hearing on Insurance Industry's Response to Irene and Alfred

The Legislature's Insurance and Real Estate Committee will hold an informational meeting and public hearing on the insurance industry's response to Tropical Storm Irene and October's Nor'easter on Tuesday, November 15 at 1:00 p.m. in Room 2D of the Legislative Office Building (LOB). The committee will examine the process by which the insurance industry responded to car, home and business owners on property claims in the wake of both storms. In addition, the committee will review complaints received by the Insurance Department from policyholders with respect to the industry's

timeliness and fairness in servicing claims. The committee will also examine the application of windstorm or hurricane deductibles. Invited speakers will make presentations from 1-2:30 p.m., and public testimony will begin at 2:30 p.m. Those submitting testimony are asked to submit 35 copies of written testimony to the Committee Staff two hours prior to the start of the hearing in Room 2800 of the LOB. Sign-up for the hearing will begin at 11:00 a.m. in Room 2800 of the LOB. Public testimony will be limited to three minutes per person.
